175th Anniversary History Lesson

June 17, 1845 was the date the Frankenmuth colonists first set foot in Michigan. Using Rev. Herman Zehnder's book, <u>Teach My People the Truth</u>, we spent the remainder of the broadcast reviewing some of the events that took place as the immigrants reached New York harbor and then travelled to the Saginaw Valley. We will share more information about this next week, probably on Tuesday.

We spent some time in the broadcast recounting some contentious issues between Pastor Craemer and the St. Lorenz members. By the time he left Frankenmuth to become a professor at the Ft. Wayne Seminary, pastor and people had grown to love one another deeply.
